Swimming Superstars

Congratulations to our junior girls relay team, Bianca, Harper, Ella and Siena who travelled to the Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre on Wednesday to compete in the Sydney West Swimming championships. The girls unfortunately did not progress out of the heats but it was a wonderful experience and we are very proud of their efforts. There were some very exciting results in the individual events with Bianca finishing second in the 200m individual medley, second in the 50m butterfly and second in the 50m backstroke. To reach a regional carnival is an outstanding achievement, to place in 3 events at that carnival is phenomenal. Well done Bianca. She will now compete in the NSW PSSA Swimming Championships in a few weeks' time. We wish her all the best.



Strategic Improvement Plan 2021 - 2024

This term our staff have been heavily engaged in creating our Strategic Improvement Plan 2021-2024. Our plan has been informed by our situational analysis and external validation which were both carried out in 2020. This document is our blueprint for success and contains 3 strategic directions; Student Growth and Attainment, Collective Efficacy and Wellbeing. In the coming weeks our plan will be endorsed by our Director, Educational Leadership and published for our community to view. Once published I encourage all parents/carers to read the plan to have a better understanding of how the school is strategically planning to support all students to achieve their potential.

National Day of Action Against Bullying – 19 March 2021

Today is the National Day of Action Against Bullying and this year's theme is **'Take Action Together'**. To mark the occasion this year we are having a buddy bench installed in our playground. A buddy bench is a place where students can sit in the playground when they may have no one to play with or are looking to make some new friends. Other students will then be able to invite them to join in their games or check in with them to see if they are ok. Teachers will monitor the bench and discuss the purpose of the bench during class time so all students are aware of its purpose. The bench has been provided to us by the Hills Clinic which is an organisation that works within our community to support mental health. North Kellyville PS formed a partnership with the Hills Clinic in 2020 when our students made artworks to be presented to the Hills Clinic on RUOK Day. The level of appreciation from the clinic for this kind gesture inspired them to provide something to assist our students here at school. The buddy bench will be presented to our SRC next week.

Restrictions Easing – Guidelines still in Place

Some restrictions have eased in relation to COVID-19 however, guidelines remain that must be adhered to. Parents/carers are allowed on site for certain activities where we have management practices in place to ensure the safety of everyone. Physical distancing, limitations on the amount of people gathering indoors and strict sign in procedures are some of the measures in place. We look forward to welcoming parents on site



in the coming weeks for our Student Leader Induction, Cross Country Carnival and Kindergarten Crazy Hat Parade. Hipwell Ave- Temporary No Parking Restrictions

The Hills Shire Council have now installed some temporary 'No Parking 8-9.30am and 2.30-4pm school days' restrictions on the eastern side of Hipwell Ave between Curtis Rd and the end of the Kiss and Drop Zone to assist in relieving some of the congestion getting in and out of the road at peak times. These parking restrictions will be removed when the Kiss and Drop Zone relocates back onto Hezlett Road. Please see image below.

Thorogood Bvd – Pedestrian Access

As of Monday 22 February, Thorogood Bvd is open for pedestrian access before and after school. This is



NOT A KISS & DROP FACILITY and we ask for all of the school community to follow the road rules to allow this entry to remain open. It is a clearly signposted **NO**

STOPPING area. Please do not drive to the end of Thorogood Bvd and drop your child/ren at the gate. Please be respectful of our neighbours by not parking across their driveways. The gate will only be opened at 8.30am until 9am in the morning and at 3pm until 3.15pm in the afternoon. Access to the site during the day will remain through the Hezlett Rd and Hipwell Ave gates.

Road Works

Thank you to the vast majority of parents and community members who have been patient and are following the correct road rules to ensure our students' safety. It has been great to see a number of people opting to "park & walk".

Key points to remember:

- **No kiss and drop facility on Hezlett Road or Thorogood Bvd during construction.**
- **A temporary kiss and drop facility has been installed on Hipwell Avenue** however capacity is much lower. Parents are advised to think carefully about whether kiss and drop is the safest form of drop off and pick up. Parents who must drive are asked to consider parking and walking into and out of the school.
- Pedestrian access via Hezlett Road is maintained.
- Hipwell Avenue has double lines. If you are caught doing a u-turn over double lines in a school zone it is a **\$457 fine and 4 demerit points**.
- Please ensure vehicles exit the kiss & drop and drive to the end of Hipwell Ave and use the turning circle.





Chess Teams 2021

Term 2, Week 2 (Week starting Monday 26 April)- Class presentations. Classroom teachers will inform students of their presentation date.

Term 2, Week 4 (Week starting Monday 10 May)- Stage competition. Students from each grade will present their formal speech again, and complete an impromptu speech (Kindergarten exempted).

|| Premier's Reading Challenge 2021 ||

North Kellyville Public School students in K-2 complete the Challenge through sharing books with the teacher librarian, their home and co-teachers. Their reading records are administered at school by the PRC coordinator, Mrs Heaton, the teacher librarian.

Years 3-6 students are encouraged to participate in the Challenge but must complete their reading records independently. Assistance is available if needed - students should consult their home class teacher or the teacher librarian, Mrs Heaton. It is recommended that students access the PRC website via their student portal.

The following information for parents/caregivers comes directly from the Premier's Reading Challenge website. The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge is managed and administered by the NSW Department of Education's [Arts Unit](#).

Tips for parents/caregivers:

- ✓ Familiarise yourself with the new [PRC student website](#). There is a video on the [PRC Support site that you can watch that demonstrates how to login, search for books and add them to a Student Reading Record \(SRR\)](#).
- ✓ Visit the [Premier's Reading Challenge Support website](#). It allows you to search for information about the PRC and how to use the PRC website and also how to [contact the PRC team](#).
- ✓ Set reminders for Challenge [opening and closing dates](#) in your and your child's calendar.
- ✓ Find out your [child's logon details](#). For public schools, students' logon will be the same one they use to access computers and the internet at school.
- ✓ Assist your child to borrow books from the school or local library. Listen to your child read and talk about the story/ characters/ information. Read to or with your child if she/he is participating in the K-2 Challenge. □ Help your child to add books to her/his Student Reading Record **regularly**.
- ✓ Follow the Arts Unit on Facebook and the NSW PRC on Instagram to keep up to date about information about the Challenge throughout the year. We regularly run contests and Author events your child may be interested in taking part in.
- ✓ Contact your child's **PRC coordinator** if:
 - Your child has any difficulty using her/his logon details to access the PRC website.
 - You are concerned that your child's name is spelt incorrectly in the PRC website.

Important notes:

If you need to check your child's Challenge history, please contact your child's PRC coordinator.

Your child's online Student Reading Record must have the required number of books recorded to complete the Challenge by the [student closing date](#). School PRC coordinators have an extra two weeks to validate the SRR. **Only students with a validated SRR are eligible for a certificate.**

In the final weeks of the Challenge, log on regularly to the website to check the status of your child's SRR. Contact your child's PRC coordinator if you are concerned your child's SRR has not been validated.

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

What if I need to cancel?

Breakfast is now available each day at vacation care until 8.15am. Afternoon tea is also provided. However, please pack morning tea, lunch and water in a drink bottle. We are unable to reheat food brought from home. Please do not send food containing nuts.

What does my child need to wear?

Penalty from \$349 and 2 demerit points




BUS ZONES

NO PARKING

You can stop only to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and you must not stop for more than 2 minutes and The driver must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$194 and 2 demerit points



DRIVEWAYS

You must not park your car over or block access to a driveway. You can stop in a driveway to drop off or pick up passengers BUT only for less than 2 minutes AND the driver must stay with the car.
