
After discussions with bus companies and other local schools, we have set our school hours to be 9:00am until 3:00pm.

Technology

Reminder About Health Care Forms

As I meet with students and parents during enrolment interviews, much of the discussion is centred on individual student needs. Every student is different and so having these conversations is critical in order to maximise the school's effectiveness in catering for needs. Students who have a medical condition which may include allergies, asthma, diabetes or the like will require support from the school in managing the condition. To this end, parents are asked to complete supplementary paperwork to go alongside enrolment forms. This paperwork assists the school to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students and must be returned to the school email (northkellyville-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au) before the end of November.

<u>Health Form 1</u> – use if your child has <u>any</u> medical condition, if asking the school to <u>administer</u> <u>medication</u>, or if requesting any other support from the school.

<u>Health Form 2</u> – use if your child's medical condition may lead to the need for an <u>emergency</u> <u>response</u>. This includes severe asthma, diabetes and anaphylaxis. This form is in addition to the child's asthma plan or ASCIA plan which should be issued by your child's doctor and also provided to the school.

<u>Health Form 3</u> – use if you would like to provide permission for the school to contact your child's doctor as needed.
