Teacher Recruitment, Training & Development

Recruitment processes have continued over the past fortnight and in coming weeks I will be able to reveal the makeup of foundation staff members. Those appointed will be of the highest quality, carefully selected to enact the bold, future-focused vision for the school. Teachers in particular will receive a thorough induction, attend training and development, and commit to a school direction of innovation and excellence prior to the start of the 2019 school year. The mixture of staff is critical and I am ensuring that teachers who possess outstanding interpersonal skills, professional commitment and teaching craft are appointed. Some will be early in their careers, motivated, with the most recent qualifications and deep knowledge of innovative practice; while others will be more experienced, bringing with them expertise refined over a number of years in a range of school settings. All will be driven, energised, high quality teachers ready to make a positive contribution to our school whose class I would be more than happy for my own sons to be assigned.

Bus Route Information

Hills Bus has advised that one of their existing school bus services will be able to accommodate North Kellyville Public School students in the morning and afternoon, and that a public bus service is also available. While the timetable is not yet available, school bus 2099 and public bus <u>615X</u> both pass the school. More information will be provided as it comes to hand. Parents of students who might catch the bus are encouraged to <u>read about applying for a student</u> <u>Opal Card</u>. Not all students will be eligible for a free pass.

Site Progress

Over 90% of the joinery has been completed, brackets for the 75" interactive panels are up in each room, glass sliding doors into classrooms have been installed and ceiling tiles and fans have been added throughout the building.

Reminder About Health Care Forms

As I meet with students and parents during enrolment interviews, much of the discussion is centred on individual student needs. Every student is different and so having these conversations is critical in order to maximise the school's effectiveness in catering for needs. Students who have a medical condition which may include allergies, asthma, diabetes or the like will require support from the school in managing the condition. To this end, parents are asked to complete supplementary paperwork to go alongside enrolment forms. This paperwork assists the school to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students and must be returned to the school email (northkellyvillep.school@det.nsw.edu.au) before the end of November.

<u>Health Form 1</u> – use if your child has <u>any</u> medical condition, if asking the school to <u>administer</u> <u>medication</u>, or if requesting any other support from the school.

<u>Health Form 2</u> – use if your child's medical condition may lead to the need for an <u>emergency response</u>. This includes severe asthma, diabetes and anaphylaxis. This form is in addition to the child's asthma plan or ASCIA plan which should be issued by your child's doctor and also provided to the school.

<u>Health Form 3</u> – use if you would like to provide permission for the school to contact your child's doctor as needed.
