Kindergarten 2020 Orientation Program

On Wednesday 30 October the first of three Kindergarten orientation sessions will take place. Parents who have successfully enrolled their child/ren will have received an email invitation. We are asking all parents to RSVP so that we know how many 'packs' to make and to ensure that the right number of personnel are available to run a successful program. Presently we are expecting between 100 and 110 students in Kindergarten next year. Orientation session 2 will take place on 6 November, and session 3 on 13 November. Current Year 5 Student Selective Schools Entry Process for 20221

Parents of students in Year 5 who wish for their child to be considered for placement in a selective high school in 2021 can now apply. Please note:

- Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2021 must be made online between 8 October 2019 and 11 November 2019. Late applications will not be accepted.
- Parents must apply online at <<u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-</u> schools/selective-high-schools-andopportunity-classes/year-7>
- All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 12 March 2020.
- Late applications will not be accepted.

School Development Day

The final day for students this year is Wednesday 18 December. Staff members ordinarily attend for two additional development days, this year on Thursday 19 and Friday 20 December. This notice is to inform the community that staff at North Kellyville PS will not be attending a development day on 20 December due to increased professional learning above and beyond the standard throughout the year. As part of the Department's processes, when a school development day is varied the principal must inform the community.

Reminder about Supervision and Hours

Supervision commences at 8:30 each morning and concludes at 3:00 each day. Unless students are formally registered with Wesley Out of School Hours Care, parents are asked to assist us by adhering to the times above. Leaving your child at school before 8:30, unsupervised is akin to leaving him/her unsupervised at a shopping centre or train station. Principals are regularly advised to report repeated lack of parental supervision to the Department of Communities and Justice.

Update on Hezlett Road

It has been a momentous week with the Roads and Maritime Service finally approving a School Crossing Supervisor for the pedestrian crossing on Hezlett Road. While this is welcome news, it will now take time for the RMS to recruit and train a supervisor. Therefore, until further notice there will be no change to the current arrangement of Brian from AAA Traffic Control supporting our students as they cross the road.

I was also informed this week that the upgrade to Hezlett Road will likely not commence until February 2020. The upgrade will cause significant inconvenience to residents and school community members who utilise the entrances on Hezlett Road. However, the end result will be well worthwhile. Ultimately, a signalised crossing will be installed outside the school. I will continue to provide updates as they come to hand and work with the community to ensure the ongoing safety of our students and their families.

Recruitment Underway

In coming weeks I will be leading recruitment processes in order to effectively staff the school in 2020 and beyond. Our growing student population means that attracting, employing and retaining the best teachers and support staff is a key exercise and one that requires significant time, thought and attention. To help me, three selection panels have been formed comprised of parent and teacher representatives elected by their peers to help make recruitment decisions. I thank in advance Kasey-Lea McGill, Samantha Newth and Stephanie Lynam who will represent the teachers and Sunayana Saad, Lisa Rohanek and Courtney Argall who will represent parents.
